#### NATIONAL GALLERY OF ART

Weekdays 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sundays 2 p.m. to 10 p.m. Admission is free to the Gallery and to all programs scheduled.

Paintings and sculpture comprising the Mellon, Samuel H. Kress, Widener, and Chester Dale Collections, with gifts from other donors, are located on the main floor. The Widener Collection of decorative arts is on the ground floor.

Twentieth-Century French Paintings from the Chester Dale Collection (including "The Sacrament of the Last Supper" by Salvador Dali). Galleries 60-A, 60-B, 62, 64.

A slide lecture, prepared by Noel Smith, Gallery Horticulturist, covering the culture and arrangement of exterior and interior plants used in the Gallery. This lecture will be given in the Gallery auditorium to garden clubs and other groups by arrangement with the Building Superintendent's office.

A radio lecture device, running continuously, is installed in eighteen exhibition galleries. The talks cover most of the periods of art represented by the collections. For 25c a visitor may rent a small receiving set to use in hearing these LecTour broadcasts.
