Paintings and sculpture comprising the Mellon, Samuel H. Kress, Widener and Chester Dale Collections, with gifts from other donors, are located on the main floor. The Widener Collection of decorative arts is on the ground floor.

Masterpieces of Impressionist and Post-Impressionist Painting. A loan exhibition of 50 paintings from private collections. Galleries 59, 60, 67, 71. Through May 24.

Twentieth-Century French Paintings from the Chester Dale Collection (including "The Sacrament of the Last Supper" by Salvador Dali). Galleries 60-A, 60-B, 62, 64.

The Gallery's Sixteenth American Music Festival will open on May 3 and continue through May 24.

A slide lecture, prepared by Noel Smith, Gallery Horticulturist, covers the Gallery's landscaping and the culture and arrangement of the plants used in the building. This lecture will be given in the Gallery auditorium to garden clubs and other groups by arrangement with the Building Superintendent's office.

A radio lecture device, running continuously, is installed in eighteen exhibition galleries. The talks cover most of the periods of art represented in the collections. For 25c a visitor may rent a small receiving set to use in hearing these LecTour broadcasts.

On May 3 and May 10, Naum Gabo, American sculptor, will give the last two of the A. W. Mellon lectures. Cards of admission are not required.
