NEW ACQUISITION

The recent major acquisition, Deborah Gerbier and Her Family, by the Flemish baroque master Peter Paul Rubens (1577-1640), is on view in Lobby A on the main floor. Painted in 1629-1630, the painting is considered one of the finest group portraits of the seventeenth century. The painting depicts the wife of Sir Balthazar Gerbier, Rubens's host during the artist's only visit to England, and their four children. Gerbier, a colorful figure and an arbiter of seventeenth-century taste, was a diplomat and art adviser to the Duke of Buckingham. The tightly composed group is gathered on the terrace of a palatial home with an expansive landscape background suggesting the view of the Thames that Rubens saw during his stay with the Gerbiers.

PRINTS OF THE ITALIAN RENAISSANCE

The first major exhibition of early Italian prints to be held in the United States in over fifty years, this exhibition consists of more than 370 engravings, niello prints, and woodcuts of the fifteenth and early sixteenth centuries. Entitled *Prints of the Italian Renaissance*, the exhibition continues on view through October 7 in the Central Gallery, ground floor. A major scholarly catalog of the Gallery's holdings in this field and a special guide to the exhibition are available in the Publications Rooms and at the exhibition.

SIXTEENTH CENTURY ITALIAN DRAWINGS FROM THE COLLECTION OF JANOS SCHOLZ

An exhibition of 114 drawings by Italian masters of the sixteenth century will open to the public September 23 in four galleries on the ground floor (G-11, G-12, G-13, and G-19). It will continue through November 25. The exhibition, entitled Sixteenth Century Italian Drawings from the Collection of Janos Scholz will be installed according to schools of Italian art. offering an opportunity to study the singular characteristics

of each artistic center in the sixteenth century. Among the artists represented will be Leonardo da Vinci, Raphael, Veronese, Titian, Tintoretto, Parmigianino, and the brothers Taddeo and Federico Zuccaro. Mr. Scholz's widely acclaimed collection is continually being refined and expanded. Some of the drawings in this collection have never before been exhibited publicly. The exhibition has been organized by Konrad Oberhuber, Curator of Drawings in the Gallery's Graphic Arts Department, and Dean Walker, a graduate student at the Institute of Fine Arts, New York University. A fully illustrated catalog, prepared by Messrs. Oberhuber and Walker accompanies the exhibition.

VENETIAN VIEWS, ETCHINGS BY CANALETTO AND WHISTLER


A selection of thirty-eight prints from the Gallery's collections by Canaletto, one of the most famous artists of the eighteenth century, and Whistler, a master etcher of the nineteenth century, have gone on view in the Corridor Gallery, ground floor. The exhibition, entitled *Venetian Views, Etchings by Canaletto and Whistler*, will remain on view through October.








