MASTER PAINTINGS FROM THE HERMITAGE AND THE STATE RUSSIAN MUSEUM, LENINGRAD

The first loan of old master paintings lent by the Soviet Union to the United States continues its inaugural showing at the National Gallery through September 9. (Note: the Gallery is open daily until 9 p.m., through Labor Day, for easy viewing of the paintings.)

The exhibition represents the first time paintings showing a cross-section of the strengths of the two great Leningrad art collections have been seen outside the USSR. Thirty European paintings from The Hermitage and thirteen by nineteenth-century Russian artists from The State Russian Museum are installed in galleries 67 through 71 on the Main Floor. In all, thirty-nine artists from seven countries are included.

SPECIAL FILM

A half-hour documentary on the Soviet loan exhibition of French impressionist and post-impressionist paintings, which opened at the National Gallery in April 1973, will be shown on Labor Day, September 1, at 2:30 p.m. in the Auditorium. The film traces the various aspects of the exhibition's preparation, from the time the paintings left The Hermitage and The Pushkin Museum to the opening night at the National Gallery.

PENNSYLVANIA GERMAN CRAFTSMANSHIP

A selection of thirty-nine watercolor renderings of eighteenth- and nineteenth-century Pennsylvania German crafts from the Index of American Design is on view in the Corridor Gallery on the ground floor. Objects illustrated include coverlets, painted chests, earthenware and ornamental carvings. The Index is a collection of over 17,000 watercolors of American crafts and folk arts from the colonial period until about 1900.






