TREASURES OF TUTANKHAMUN THROUGH MARCH 15—EXTENDED HOURS

Treasures of Tutankhamun will be open extra hours until 8:30 p.m. daily through March 15.

Treasures of Tutankhamun continues on view in the ground floor galleries through March 15. Six films in the BBC film series on the exhibition will be shown in the Gallery Auditorium at 12 noon Monday through Saturday. In addition, In the Beginning: The Mystery of Ancient Egypt, a one-hour film narrated by Kenneth Clark, will be screened on Sunday, March 6 at 2 and 4 p.m. in the Gallery Auditorium.

After leaving the National Gallery, the exhibition will be seen in Chicago at the Field Museum (April 15 through August 15), the New Orleans Museum of Art (September 15 through January 15, 1978), the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (February 15 through June 15, 1978), the Seattle Art Museum (July 15 through November 15, 1978), and at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York (December 15 through April 15, 1979).

DUTCH DRAWINGS AND PRINTS

Eighty-seven drawings revealing the extraordinary range of expression found in seventeenth-century Dutch art continue on view at the National Gallery through March 13 in a special loan exhibition Seventeenth-Century Dutch Drawings from American Collections. The drawings on loan are supplemented by an additional eighty prints, a number of related drawings and several books selected by the National Gallery primarily from its collections.

NEW PAINTING ACQUISITION

The Invocation, one of the last paintings executed by the French post-impressionist Paul Gauguin, has been acquired by the National Gallery as a gift from the collection of John and Louise Booth, in memory of their daughter Winkie. Mr. Booth's parents, Ralph and Mary Booth, were among the Gallery's early donors of Renaissance paintings and sculpture. The painting is on view among the Gallery's eight other Gauguin paintings.

Paul Gauguin, a Paris stockbroker, began his career as an amateur painter in the Impressionist style and retired from business in 1883 to devote his life to painting. During the next eight years, Gauguin traveled to the South Seas, to the south of France with Vincent van Gogh and later settled briefly in Brittany. In 1891 he embarked for Tahiti, a primeval island of rich tropical color, where he developed his mature style characterized by simplified, patterned forms and broad areas of intense, exotic color.

In 1901 Gauguin left Tahiti for the more primitive island of Hiva Oa in the Marquesas and here his palette became more iridescent and intense. *The Invocation*, a characteristic tropical scene, dates from 1903, the year of Gauguin's death. The white cross on the hill in the distance marks the cemetery near Atuona where Gauguin was to be buried a year after completing this painting. It is the first example from this very late period to enter the Gallery's collection.
