

The Gallery is located between 3rd and 7th Streets, N.W., on Constitution Avenue. The East and West Buildings are connected by an all-weather underground passage with a moving walkway. Entrances to the West Building are on the Mall, on Constitution Avenue at 6th Street, which has a ramp for the handicapped, and off 4th Street. The entrance to the East Building is on 4th Street off National Gallery Plaza and also has a ramp for the handicapped.



The American painter Samuel F. B. Morse's Gallery of the Louvre, painted between 1831 and 1833, was the result of a special relationship between Morse and the writer James Fenimore Cooper. The two men intended the work to be a means of furthering the cultural development of the United States by bringing famous European works to America in the form of a monumental "gallery picture." The painting, which depicts 38 masterpieces in the Louvre by Rembrandt, Leonardo, Raphael, and others, is installed near galleries containing original


