


INSTALLATION

Celebrating Van Gogh at the National Gallery of Art

June 8—September 7 West Building, Main Floor, M-83

The Portrait of Joseph Roulin, on loan from the Netherlands' Kröller-Müller Museum, portrays both a friend and muse of the artist. Van Gogh also immortalized the postman's infant daughter in the Gallery's own Roulin's Baby (1888). In this special installation, father and daughter are reunited alongside seven other Van Gogh works including the recent acquisition Green Wheat Fields, Auvers (1890).

Vincent van Gogh's "Still Life of Oranges and Lemons with Blue Gloves" (1889)

On view indefinitely West Building, Main Floor, M-83

This gift from the estate of Paul Mellon (1907–1999) came to the Gallery after the passing of his widow, Rachel Lambert Mellon (1910–2014), the renowned arts patron and master gardener. Some 110 works of art in the Mellon bequest remained in Rachel Lambert Mellon's care after her husband's death on February 1, 1999, including this highlight. It is on view for the first time since 1962 in this very special installation of Van Gogh works.

CONTINUING EXHIBITION

Andrew Wyeth: Looking Out, Looking In

Through November 30 West Building, Main Floor

One of Wyeth's most important paintings, Wind from the Sea (1947), a recent gift to the Gallery, is celebrated in an exhibition that focuses upon his frequent use of the window as a subject. Wyeth returned to windows repeatedly, producing more than 300 works that explore the formal and conceptual richness of looking both in and out of windows. Some 60 of these watercolors, drawings, and tempera paintings are on view, many for the first time.

CONTINUING EXHIBITION INSTALLATION

Degas/Cassatt

Through October 5 West Building, Main Floor

Edgar Degas's influence upon Mary Cassatt has long been acknowledged, but her role in shaping his artistic production and in preparing the way for his warm reception in America is fully examined in this exhibition for the first time. Focusing on the critical period from the late 1870s through the mid-1880s when they were most closely allied, this exhibition brings together some 70 works in a variety of media to illustrate the artistic dialogue that developed between them. Building upon groundbreaking technical analysis, *Degas/Cassatt* also presents new insights into these artists' approaches, particularly in terms of subject matter, media, and methods.

During World War II, military officers were deployed to protect historical monuments, art, and archives in war theaters and to oversee restitution of works of art looted by the Nazis. This archival display explores the Gallery's seminal role in the creation of the Monuments, Fine Arts, and Archives (MFAA) program in the military, the Roberts Commission, and the experiences of monuments officers assigned to duty abroad. World War IIera photographs, documents, and memorabilia—many never before exhibited—are on view in this special presentation.
