"Arpeggione" Sonata in A Minor

(The arpeggione, or guitar-violoncello, was a sixstringed instrument, played by a bow, invented in 1923. It soon fell into disuse, and owes its fame chiefly to this sonata. In size it resembled a small 'cello with a guitar-shaped body; the finger-board had frets, and the strings were tuned in fourths with the exception of the fourth and fifth strings which were tuned in thirds. Since the range of the arpeggione approximates that of the viola and violoncello, this sonata may be played today on either instrument.)
