Gian Francesco Malipiero (1882- )

Rispetti e Strambotti

Rispetti and Strambotti are two ancient Italian forms of poetry. The former is an address of love, the latter a kind of roundelay. In adapting these to musical form, Malipiero attempted to sketch a varied picture of society in the Renaissance from peasant to clergy. The quartet consists of 20 loosely connected episodes, divided by pauses into three larger sections. Bearing the dedication "A Madame Frederic S. Coolidge", the world premiere took place at Pittsfield, Massachusetts, September 25, 1920 in performance by the Letz String Quartet.
