Charles Hommann (dates unknown) Overtüra (c.1840)

Edited and reconstructed by Donald M. McCorkle (1963-64). The Overture, dedicated to Weiss, the bass-trombonist, became the property of the Moravian Church, Bethlehem, Pennsylvania; and was found by the editor in 1961. No score has been found and the flute parts are missing. The flutes have been reconstructed by carefully studying Hommann's use of flutes in his other Overture and his Symphony. The Overtura is given its first Washington performance this evening through permission of the Moravian Music Foundation, Inc. The orchestral material is on loan from the Edwin A. Fleisher Music Collection of the Free Library of Philadelphia.
