Seventeen year old Mimi Poirier, who began her musical studies at the age of six, is a pupil of Yvonne Hubert at the Vincent d'Indy School of Music, in Montreal.

At the age of ten, she was first heard, as a soloist, with the Montreal Symphony Orchestra. She played again with the Orchestra at the age of thirteen and, more recently, performed on a radio program the First Movement of Beethoven's "Emperor" Concerto in a CBC presentation of the "National Talent Festival".

She placed first, three years ago, in a television competition for young musicians, and has received awards from the "Quebec Music Festivals".

Working toward her Master's degree this year, she won first prize in a Ladies' Morning Club competition, and was also heard recently in half hour recitals over the radio, a guest of "Producer's Choice" for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation.

Mimi Poirier, the youngest of the twenty-two participants, was second place winner during September, 1969 at the Johann Sebastian Bach International Piano Competitions in Washington, D. C.
