RICHARD TODD's diverse performing background includes orchestra, chamber music, solo and jazz appearances around the country. A graduate of Southern California, Mr. Todd has participated in music festivals in the Grand Tetons, the Music Academy of the West and Tanglewood. He was Gold Medalist in the 1980 Concourse Internationale in Toulon, France. Mr. Todd has studied with Waldemar Linder, James Decker, Gunther Schuller and Vincent de Rosa and has performed under the batons of Leonard Bernstein, Seiji Ozawa, Klaus Tennstedt, Sergiu Comissiona and Gerard Schwarz.

Formerly principal horn of the New Orleans Philharmonic Orchestra under Leonard Slatkin, Mr. Todd resides in California where he has been a member of the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra and the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra Winds group. He is also active as a free-lance musician and works for the motion picture and television industry.

JAMES GEMMELL has received international acclaim as a soloist and chamber musician, performing with artists Ani Kavafian, Tossy Spivakovsky, Jaime Laredo, Shlomo Mintz, and Paul Doktor traveling to Canada, South American, Europe and Korea. In Russia, Mr. Gemmell was the only American to receive the Chamber Music Award for his performances with Gold Medal winner Nathaniel Rosen in the sixth Tchaikovsky International Cello Competion. He resides in New York City.
