At the age of 11, pianist JULIANA OSINCHUK was rushed to Carnegie Hall to perform as a substitute for the indisposed Jean Casadesus. Heralded by *The New York Times* as "an important new talent," this young artist had won her first competition four years earlier and had already begun her studies at the Fontainebleau School with Nadia Boulanger.

Ms. Osinchuk has since achieved an international reputation as an artist of exceptional ability. As both a soloist and chamber musician, she has performed throughout Europe, including appearances in London, Munich, Brussels, Athens, and Rotterdam, and is a sought-after performer in the United States, as well. She has collaborated with such noted artists as Anna Moffo, Wanda Wilkomirska, Ruggiero Ricci, and Jan Peerce and has been heard over radio in Boston, New York and throughout Europe.

The recipient of the bachelors, masters, and doctor of musical arts degrees from the Juillard School, Ms. Osinchuk's teachers have included Rosina Lhevinne, Nadia Reisenberg, Louise Talma, Martin Canin, Herbert Rogers and Alexander Eydelman, Her frequent lecture/recitals, as well as her recording of Ukrainian piano works on the Orion label, have met with unanimous praise.

Ms. Osinchuk is presently on the music faculty of the State University of New York.
