Born in 1954 to a family of musicians in Riga, Latvia, YOSIF FEIGELSON began studying cello at the age of six. By the age of twelve, he was performing Schumann's Cello Concerto, and at thirteen he won the Special Prize in the Music Competition of the Western Republics of the Soviet Union, in which all of the other contestants were at least nineteen. In 1970, he received the First Prize in the Prague International Competition, and he has been finalist in both the Tchaikowsky Competition in Moscow and the J.S. Bach Competition in Leipzig. He has participated in a number of major festivals, including Berlin's "Musik-Biennale", Moscow's "Russian Winter" and Riga's "Jurmala Summer Concerts". As concerto soloist, he has appeared with the Prague Symphony, the Gewandhaus Orchestra in Leipzig and the Moscow State Orchestra.

Since immigrating to the United States in 1981, Mr. Feigelson has performed throughout the country, including recent concerto appearances with the Charleston, South Carolina, Symphony and the Westchester Philharmonia Orchestra in New York. He was also a guest performer at the 1987 "Musiktreffen" in St. Moritz, Switzerland.
