LAWRENCE SCHUBERT has received outstanding critical acclaim for his four major New York recitals at Town Hall and Carnegie Hall. Mr. Schubert has been heard as recitalist in London at the Purcell Room and at Wigmore Hall.

In addition to an extensive repertoire of standard literature of all periods, Lawrence Schubert enjoys presenting rarely heard works of Ernö Dohnányi, Nikolay Metner and Paul Hindemith. He is a member of the faculty at Molloy College in Rockville Center, New York.
