SAMUEL GORDON is professor of music and chair of the music department at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County. An active performer and conductor as well as a composer, he is the tenor soloist of the National Gallery Vocal Arts Ensemble and conducts the Maryland Choral Society. Four of Dr. Gordon's compositions have been premiered at the National Gallery, as well as his adaptations of songs by Charles Ives. His most recent appearance as soloist with the National Gallery Orchestra occurred in December of 1991, when he sang the role of Bastien in a concert performance of Mozart's *Bastien und Bastienne* under the director of George Manos.

The MARYLAND CAMERATA has been featured in every season of concerts at the National Gallery of Art since 1985, when it was known as the UMBC Camerata. In addition to presenting the Gallery's traditional Christmas concert, the ensemble has provided its American Music Festival with three programs of American choral music. Under the direction of Dr. Gordon, the Maryland Camerata has completed seven tours of Europe, and has presented the first European performances of numerous works by American composers.

Concerts from the National Gallery are broadcast in their entirety at 7:00 p.m. on Sundays on Radio Station WGTS, 91.9 FM, four weeks after the live performance. The use of cameras or recording equipment is not allowed.
