

The Musicians

ARS VOCALIS

Recognized for exceptional Puerto Rican and international programming, Ars Vocalis is an ensemble of singers who are deeply committed to the artistic and educational values of choral music. Founded in 1999 by William Rivera Ortiz, the ensemble has represented Puerto Rico in many important festivals, including the Choral Festival Villa de Sotomayor in Puerto Rico; Coleraine International Choral Festival in Northern Ireland; Festival of Sacred Music Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina in Rome; International Advent Singing in Vienna; International Choral Festival in Stowe, Vermont; and Festival Cantus Salisburgensis in Salzburg. In 2008 the choir represented Puerto Rico in the nineteenth Concorso Internazionale di Canto Corale in Verona, Italy, and was awarded the first prize. It has been invited to perform with the Puerto Rico Symphony Orchestra and the Philharmonic Orchestra of Puerto Rico "Arturo Somohano." Under the sponsorship of the Institute of Puerto Rican Culture, Ars Vocalis' recorded concert of music by Puerto Rican composers, *Al son de mi voz*, was released as a CD in 2012.

WILLIAM RIVERA ORTIZ

Founder and artistic director of Ars Vocalis since 1999, William Rivera Ortiz is director of the Puerto Rico National Choir and chair of the department of choral activities at the Conservatorio de Música de Puerto Rico, where he teaches choral conducting, diction, and sight singing. Rivera's artistic collaborations include choral performances with Alfredo Kraus, Luciano Pavarotti, and Plácido Domingo as well as preparation of choruses for conductors Odón Alonso, Roselín Pabón, and Raymond Torres. Rivera has served as a clinician and jury member in conducting workshops, seminars, forums, choral festivals, and competitions in Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, the United States, and Venezuela. Other ensembles Rivera has conducted include the choir of the Disciples of Christ Church in Sierra Linda, Bayamón, Puerto Rico; San Juan Children's Choir; and University of Puerto Rico Chorus.

A member of Chorus America, the International Federation of Choral Music, Puerto Rico Choral Association, and American Choral Directors Association, Rivera was elected president of the Puerto Rico Choral Association in 1991, and five years later represented the University of Miami at the American Choral Directors Association in Norfolk, Virginia. He received the doctor of musical arts degree from the University of Miami, master of music from Temple University, and bachelor of music from the Conservatorio de Música de Puerto Rico.
