THOMAS CIRCLE SINGERS

The Thomas Circle Singers' dual artistic and social service mission sets it apart from other choral ensembles and arts organizations in the region. The group performs diverse chamber choral works of the highest quality for Washington-area audiences while also raising awareness and support for local social service organizations dedicated to underserved communities. Founded in 1976, the Thomas Circle Singers (TCS) grew out of a music group based at Thomas Circle's Luther Place Memorial Church. The new group believed that sharing music's beauty could help transform what was at that time a neglected community. By donating its proceeds to underserved communities and providing a forum for living composers to discuss their new works with the audiences who hear them in its concerts, TCS has evolved to fill a unique niche in a city that offers numerous choral groups.

JAMES KREGER

Artistic Director James Kreger, now in his twenty-sixth season with the award-winning Thomas Circle Singers, continues his long-time advocacy of contemporary American music and performances of emerging composers' works. In recognition for his work with TCS, Kreger was honored with WETA—FM's Hometown Hero award. Formerly the director of choral programs in Maryland, New Jersey, New York, and the Virgin Islands, he has led workshops and choir festivals throughout the Mid-Atlantic region and guest conducted the Metropolitan Chorus and the Germantown Oratorio Society.

He holds bachelor of music and master of music degrees from Westminster Choir College and was the recipient of an Alumni Merit Award in 2008. A member of the music faculty of the Landon School, he also serves as organist and choirmaster at Saint John's Episcopal Church in Olney, Maryland.
