Abstract	This collection consists of research materials created and assembled by David Doheny for his 2006 publication <i>David Finley: Quiet Force for</i> <i>America's Arts,</i> a biography of the National Gallery founding director and close associate of Andrew W. Mellon, the museum founder.

Biographical Note

David A. Doheny was a corporate and real estate lawyer in Chicago and Miami, where he also served as Assistant State and U.S. Attorney. He served as vice-president and general counsel at the National Trust for Historic Preservation in Washington, DC from 1985 to 1996 where he developed in interest in its founding chairman, David Finley, who was also the first director of the National Gallery of Art. Doheny produced a small biographical profile in 1999, *David E. Finley: Statesman of the Arts*, which was later expanded and published as *David Finley: Quiet Force for America's Arts* in 2006.

Scope and Content

The collection documents the research activities of Doheny for his publication, *David Finley: Quiet Force for America's Arts.* Included are correspondence, photographs, and related material. Of note is an unpublished manuscript about Andrew W. Mellon written by Burton J. Hendricks.
