Abstract	This collection consists of research materials created and assembled by Ellen B. Hirschland for her articles on Chester and Maud Dale for the <i>Dictionary of American Biography</i> .

Biographical Note

Ellen Berney Hirschland (1918-1999) was a writer and biographer. Hirschland grew up in Baltimore, Maryland. She was the great niece of the Cone sisters, prominent art collectors in Baltimore. In 1936 Hirschland traveled with Etta Cone to Switzerland and Paris, where she was introduced to artists, dealers, and collectors. While in Paris she developed a friendship with artist Henri Matisse. Hirschland received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Wheaton College in Norton, Massachusetts. She taught art history in the Adult Education Program in Great Neck, New York, where she lived with her family.

Hirschland lectured regularly on the Cone sisters and on modern art. Her lectures were given in various museums, such as the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, the Baltimore Museum of Art, and the Kunstmuseum Luzern. She curated exhibitions and wrote scholarly articles for the Museum of Modern Art in New York City and the Heckscher Museum of Art in Huntington, New York. With her daughter, Nancy Hirschland Ramage, she wrote *The Cone Sisters of Baltimore: Collecting at Full Tilt*, which was published posthumously in 2008 by Northwestern University Press.

Scope and Content

The collection documents the research activities of Ellen B. Hirschland for her articles on Chester and Maud Dale for the *Dictionary of American Biography*. Hirschland conducted interviews with Dale family members and friends, including Chester's second wife Mary Dale, Maud's granddaughter Dale Thompson Picot, and Chester's secretary Louise Marock. Of interest are her notes with unique information about her interviewees' memories of the Dales.
